This June, escape the big smoke to enjoy an outdoor evening of talks, live music and delicious food and drinks in the beautiful grounds of Home Farm, North London. Join our stellar line-up of Explorers and Olympians around the campfire and be inspired by their tales of high adventure. With music from The Bonfire Band, craft beer, along with a complimentary wood-fired pizza, brace yourselves for a summer's night to remember.

**Ed Stafford** was supported by the Transglobe Expedition Trust, when, on the 9th August 2010, after a journey of over 860 days, he entered the Guinness Book of Records having become the first man to walk the entire length of the Amazon River. His tale was produced as a film *Walking the Amazon* for Channel 5 and the Discovery Channel and also made a best-selling book. In 2011 he became European Adventurer of the Year and in 2012 Ed was dropped on an uninhabited tropical island for 60 days with no food, water, tools, equipment, or even any clothes. He documented the ordeal for the Discovery hit TV series *Naked and Marooned*.

**Steve Backshall** is a BAFTA-winning English naturalist, writer and television presenter, best known for BBC TV's *Deadly 60*. His other BBC work includes being part of the expedition teams in *Lost Land of the Tiger*, *Lost Land of the Volcano* and *Lost Land of the Jaguar*, and he has worked for the National Geographic Channel and the Discovery Channel. He has had his own season of programmes on EdeN television channel, alongside legends David Attenborough and Bruce Parry. Before that, he was 'Adventurer in Residence' at the National Geographic Channel.

**Helen Glover and Heather Stanning** are professional rowers who at the 2012 Olympic Games set the Olympic record and won the gold medal in the women's coxless pairs, the first gold medal won by Team GB at the 2012 Games and the first Olympic gold medal for British women's rowing. The pair went on to set the world record time at the 2014 World Rowing Championships in Amsterdam. Helen is currently the reigning women's champion of the BBC's *Olympic Superstars*.

**Alastair Humphreys** is an adventurer, author and film maker. Following a 46,000 mile bicycle journey around the world, rowing the Atlantic and crossing Iceland and India on foot, Alastair launched a campaign to create local adventures for everyone. Without leaving the UK, he embarked on a year of microadventures—small, local trips to demonstrate that adventure is easy to find. He hiked the M25, swam the Thames, used public transport to get out of the city and sleep out underneath the stars, and drifted down rivers in tractor inner tubes. In 2012 he was named one of National Geographic's *Adventurers of the Year*.

**Sir Ranulph Fiennes** is described by the Guinness Book of Records as "the world's greatest living explorer". From 1979 – 82 he led the Transglobe Expedition, one of Fiennes' most epic journeys to circumnavigate the world on its polar axis, using only surface transport. In total, the team covered 52,000 miles over three years. Since then he has made unsupported trips to both poles, run seven marathons in seven days in seven continents and summited Everest. Most recently, in April 2015, he became the oldest Briton to complete the *Marathon des Sables* in aid of Marie Curie.

**The Bonfire Band** combine the groove and attitude of the old American folk and blues players with songs and lyrics all of their own. Double bass, drums and guitar produce warm, foot-tapping rhythms that tread a fine line between relaxed and up-beat.

## How to get there:

### By Tube

Stanmore station, at the northern end of the Jubilee Line, is the closest at only 3 miles away, and Jubilee Cars (tel: 02089548000) will bring you to Home Farm in around 10 minutes.

Alternatively take the Northern Line to Edgware (3.6 miles away) or High Barnet (6 miles away). There are 24 hour taxi services at both these stations.

### By Train

Elstree & Borehamwood has regular trains from Blackfriars or Farringdon which take approximately 25 minutes, and the farm is 1.5 miles away if you fancy walking or 3 miles by taxi from the station.

Alternatively Bushey Station takes approximately 20 minutes from London Euston and is less than 5 miles by taxi to Home Farm.

### Shuttle Bus

A complimentary shuttle bus will be available from 10.30pm onwards taking guests from the Farm to Elsetree & Borehamwood train station.
